STUDENTS



- Materials spread across multiple tools/places
- Broken links
- Not interactive
- Inconsistent across courses



LIBRARIANS



- Labor intensive, manual process
- Limited visibility into lecturers' needs and collection usage
- Copyright breach concerns



INSTRUCTORS



- Tedious process of curating list from multiple sources
- Limited visibility into materials availability
- No visibility to learning effectiveness

Integrated and automated digitization, acquisition and licensing workflows



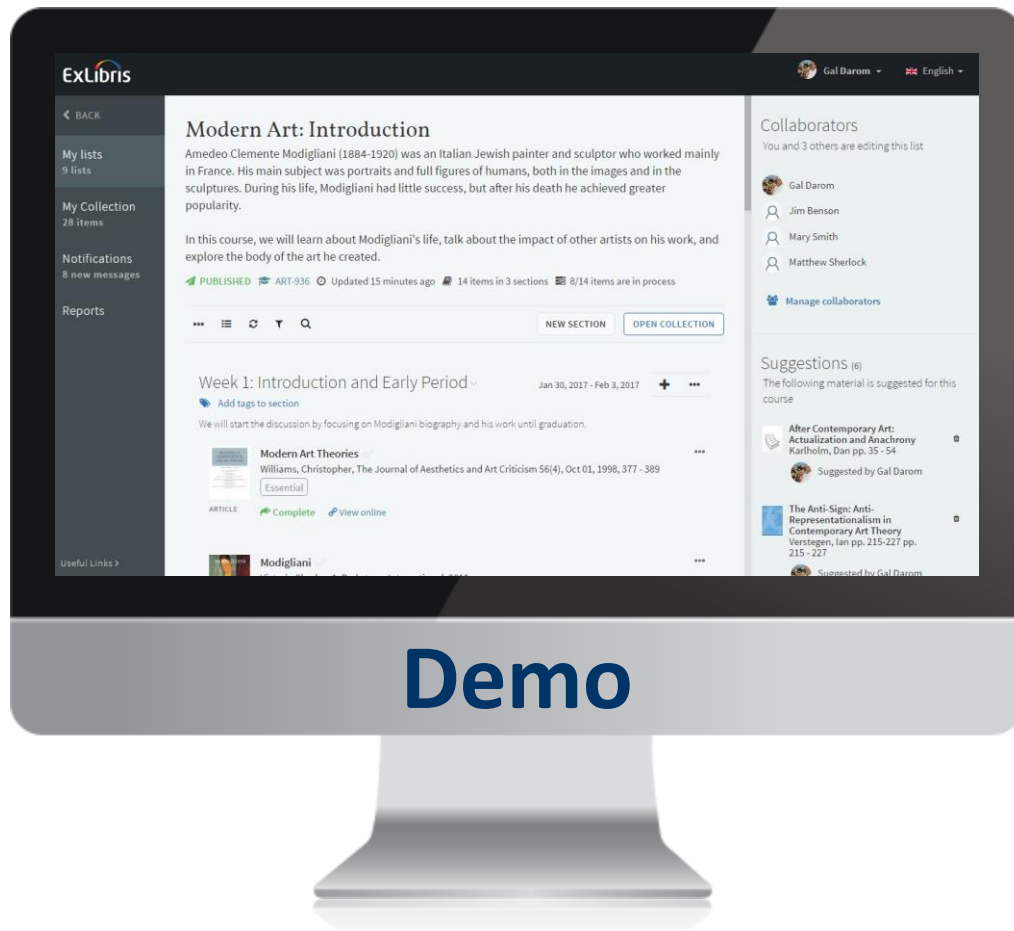
